IPAS (Indiana Protection and Advocacy)

Indiana's federally designated protection and advocacy system for the rights of people with disabilities. Provides information, advocating for rights in all areas of life, investigates reports of abuse or neglect, assures privacy rights, and corrects discrimination.

IIDC (Indiana Institute on Disability and Community)

Works with communities to welcome, value, and support the meaningful participation of people of all ages and abilities through research, education and services. Comprised of centers that address life span issues in early intervention, school improvement and inclusion, transition, employment and careers, age-related change, Autism spectrum disorders, individual and family perspectives, planning and policy, disability information and referral, community agencies, schools, advocacy organizations, government, institutions of higher education and other community partners.
